

Rolf Mützenich has represented Cologne as a Member of the German Bundestag for the Social Democratic Party (SPD) since 2002. In his work as a Member of the Bundestag, Rolf Mützenich focuses on foreign policy and arms control. His area of expertise is the Middle East, where he has substantial experience both in Israel and in Arab countries. He has joined the delegation of the German Foreign Minister, Frank-Walter Steinmeier, on his frequent trips to the region and worked on Germany's Middle East initiatives. He has written extensively on the regional security framework and the role of regional powers like Syria and Iran, nuclear proliferation and Iran's nuclear ambitions, the Israeli-Palestinian peace process, and the role of the German Armed Forces in Lebanon.

Rolf Mützenich serves as a full member of the Foreign Affairs Committee and the Subcommittee on Disarmament and Arms Control. He is an alternate member on the Committee for Work and Social Security. Since 2004, Rolf Mützenich has also served as the speaker on disarmament for the SPD caucus. Prior to his election to the Bundestag, Rolf Mützenich was head of the president's office of the Parliament in North Rhine Westphalia. From 1989-1993, he was member of the Security Policy Commission of the SPD National Executive Committee.
